### **60th anniversary at Oberg Industries**

In 1948, Donald Oberg started a manufacturing venture, believing tungsten carbide could be used in high-speed stamping dies.

The venture paid off. Oberg has grown to specialize in metal stamping, plating and tooling and multi-axis machining and grinding.

Oberg marked its 60th anniversary on May 17 with an open house and tours of its facilities.

Then called Oberg Manufacturing, the business started in Tarentum, Allegheny County. Eventually, the company relocated to Buffalo Township.

Its reach also has extended beyond Pennsylvania's borders. Oberg has two plants in Buffalo Township, one in Chandler, Ariz., in Tecate, Mexico, and in Barreal de Heredia, Costa Rica. It also has sales and service offices in Europe and Asia.

Oberg's products are used in multiple industries, including medical, aerospace, construction and automotive.
